

Observations

- Self evident truths are what bind mankind into one common humanity.
- Common bond of self evident truths are substantial principles for national unity.

Historical Application: England and The United States

Common Law, in Great Britain and the United States, the unwritten law, the law that receives its binding force from immemorial usage and universal reception, in distinction from the written or statute law. That body of rules, principles, and customs which have been received from our ancestors and by which courts have been governed in their judicial decisions. The evidence of this law is to be found in the reports of these decisions, and the records of the courts. Some of these rules may have originated in edicts or statutes which are now lost, or in the terms and conditions of particular grants or charters; but it is most probable that many of them originated in judicial decisions founded on natural justice and equity, or on local customs.
